Gardener Badge	Seasons of growth and planting coriander	 Activity 1: Identifying Seasons for Growth Working in patrols, provide Cubs with images of fruits and seeds, and task them with matching each fruit to its corresponding seed Activity 2: Introduction to Gardening Tools Introduce cubs to essential gardening tools such as watering cans, clogs, gloves, pots, and trowels Task cubs with matching the correct terminology to each tool or item within their patrols Activity 3: Planting coriander Within patrols, take turns filling pots with soil, planting seeds, and decorating plant labels and personalising their pots Pro tips: Find a local garden or allotment and grow plants/tree Visit nature reserves Volunteer at Muslim farms (e.g. Willowbrook Farm in Oxford or Harmony Farm near Cardiff) Islamic principle/link: "The world is beautiful and verdant, and verily God, the exalted, has made you His stewards in it, and He sees how you acquit yourselves" (Saheeh Muslim).

Scientist Badge	Various experiments	Activity 1: PH Experiment Split cubs into patrols and assign them a table Explain what PH, alkaline and acid are Use red cabbage as ph indicator and test different household items, eg orange juice, lemon, water, apple juice, bleach Apple juice: ph 2.9-3.5 (light red) acidic WATER: neutral (remains green) neither acidic nor alkaline Bleach: ph 11 (light yellow) alkaline Activity 2: Magic Milk experiment Pour milk into a bowl and add drops of 2 different food colouring Dip a cotton into dish soap and then dip into the milk Watch the colours mixl Activity 3: Volcano eruption Design a volcano using foil and coloured paper to design. Build around a small bottle Once built add in vinegar and baking soda for a cool elephant toothpaste reaction! Have a tray under volcano to prevent spillage on table/floor OR take volcano outdoors once it's built Activity 4: Holding fire Add the propane gas into a bucket of water and add soap Grab some soap in your hand Light your hand and it will ignite Islamic principle/link: Men such as Ibn Sina, Al Haytham and Al-Raziwho were pioneering revolutionary new ideas between the 9th and 14th centuries. Their innovations and work paved the way for discoveries to be made that are still in place to this day.

Astronomer Badge	Exploring space	Activity 1: Ordering Planets Use different sized fruits to represent the planets Place the planets in the correct order Once completed, discuss and correct any incorrect placements Craft alternative: make paper mache planets Activity 2: Phases of the Moon Use a sandwich biscuit (like an Oreo) to demonstrate different phases of the moon Split the biscuit in half, use the side with the cream and using a spoon carve out the phases of the moon e.g gibbous, crescent etc. Activity 3: Life in space Create 3 stations to understand life in space: Calculate what your height would be in space by multiplying height with 1.03 Complete different challenges using gloves to emulate how astronauts have to do tasks in their space suits. For example: picking up rice, threading macaroni through string and building a house of cards. Complete a series of fitness challenges, such as, planking, running and push ups, to understand how fit astronauts need to be to go into space. Activity 4: Constellations Craft activity Use pipe cleaners or skewers and styrofoam balls to create the shape of constellations Islamic principle/link: There are numerous Qur'anic references that detail Allah SWT miracle in the heavens, skies, and universe: "And def His signs are the night and day and the sun and the moon, each in an orbit floating (21:33) "And of His signs are the night and day and the sun and moon. Do not prostrate to the sun or to the moon, but prostrate to Allah, who created them, if it should be Him that you worship" (41: 37)

Show the cubs the main 4 swimming strokes with actions & get everyone to imitate Activity 3: swimming rules Paper and pens needed Get the cubs in their packs and get them to write down swimming rules Then everyone shares their rules and we discuss the actual swimming rules Islamic principle/link: The sports and physical skills practised and recommended by the Prophet Muhammad, upon him blessings and peace, included archery, camel and horse racing, sword and spear among other weapon training, running, swimming and wrestling.

Try using a crutch. Rotate so every group has a go at every station Activity 4: Learn the Adhan in sign language Islamic principle/link: Remind the Cubs that Allah SWT is the all-knowing (Al-Aleem) who created us all beautiful and perfect. Teach the children to constantly say 'Alhamdulillah' to thank Allah for the functions we may take for granted or not realise we have, like the ability to walk. "For indeed, with hardship [will be] ease" (94:5)

Include famous monuments and people Ask the cubs to read a slide of the presentation out to the group Discuss if they recognise the monuments or people Activity 3: Make a poster advertisement Paper and colours needed Get the cubs to make an advertisement poster or leaflet to promote their city Ask the cubs to present their work Islamic principle/link: Appreciation for the world that Allah has given us. "He Who created all things in the best way and He began the creation of man from clay" (al-Sajdah 32:7)

The last one there is out of the game Sink items: coins, rocks, phones, computers, cars, hand grenades, oxygen tanks, spade, tin of beans, marbles Float items: tennis balls, fish skeletons, boats, plastic bottles, wooden ducks, marshmallows, straws, a tonne of feathers Islamic principle/link: Remind the Cubs to always rely (Tawakul) on Allah SWT and that He protects His slaves from hardship and evil (Al-Hafeedh) Dua before leaving the house/ Bismillah before any action/ Alhamdulillah regularly

Communicator Badge	Forms of communication	Activity 1: Sign language Discuss how people with hearing and visual impairment communicate with others Learn how to say Hi, thank you, bye in sign language Activity 2: Decoding using ciphers Create a treasure hunt, where each location is revealed using riddles, compass directions and ciphers Activity 3: Minefield Create a grid with obstructions Each patrol has one leader who can see and is instructing the team The rest of the patrol is blindfolded and standing in a line, ready to enter the grid They must follow the instructions of the leader, who is directing the team to avoid the obstacles Islamic principles/link: Cubs can be guided to the tools of effective communication; leaders can set the example of our Prophet SAW communication etiquette and try to instil this in all cubs Cubs should learn to greet all Muslims with the greeting of Islam: "When two Muslims meet and shake hands, Allah forgives the sins of both before they depart" (Hadith - Abu Dawud) Smiling and good manners: Luqman's advise to his son "O my son, Let your speech be good and your face be smiling; you will be more loved by the people than those who give them provisions"

Helping others is emphasised in Islam, and learning humility and being charitable are characteristics as muslims we should strive to have.

Global Issues Badge	Create care packages	 Activity 1: introduction into Charity work Get Cubs to learn about one international charity that distributes aid or food to the needy and discuss the importance of this for those communities Activity 2: Create care packages Organise a project where Cubs assemble care packages for local or international charities These could include non-perishable foods, hygiene products, and school supplies Discuss how these items can make a difference in the lives of people around the world, including examples of specific places, or women and children in conflict settings around the world Islamic principle/link: One of the five pillars is zakat and offering of charity - we are obliged to do so As Muslims, we should be quick to be generous and charitable, as no one person becomes poor from giving charity "Everyone turns to their own direction of prayer. So compete with one another in doing good. Wherever you are, Allah will bring you all together for judgment. Surely Allah is Most Capable of everything". [Quran 2:148]

Chef Badge	Cooking stir fry	 Activity 1: Hygiene Discuss hygiene rules in the kitchen (hand washing, hair tied, touching face, handling meat) Interactive teaching: present images of a kitchen and have the cubs identify the hazards Activity 2: Kitchen safety Fire, sharp objects, slippery floors Interactive teaching: role play Activity 3: Healthy eating Discuss what makes a balanced meal Eating in moderation Activity 4: Stir fry Divide into packs Create a competitive game with leaders as judges Top tip: re-enact the Great British Bake Off, Come Dine With Me, or MasterChef formats Islamic principle/link: The Sunnah of Prophet Muhammad S.A.W. recommends eating foods like fruits, vegetables, grains, meat, fish, honey, dates, and olives. The Prophet S.A.W. said: "The son of Adam does not fill any vessel worse than his stomach. It is sufficient for the son of Adam to eat a few morsels to keep him alive. If he must fill it, then one-third for his food, one-third for his drink, and one-third for air." (al-Tirmidhi)

Air Activities Staged Badge	Creating aircrafts	 Activity 1: Golden age of Islam Discuss Abbas ibn Firnas, a 9th century Muslim engineer, poet, inventor, and mathematician, is considered to be the first person to fly using a flying machine Ibn Firnas made the world's first-ever flying machine from silk and eagle feathers and jumped from a mountain while strapped into it Activity 2: Design and create aircraft Make paper aeroplanes, explore different designs and what might make a paper plane more/less efficient Have a competition between the different planes Activity 3: Drop the egg In packs, cubs create a parachute for an egg, ensuring the egg is protected and does not crack during flight or when it lands Once parachutes are ready, drop from a height

And remember the favor of Allah upon you - when you were enemies and He brought your hearts together and you became, by His favor, brothers. And you were on the edge of a pit of the Fire, and He saved you from it. Thus does Allah make clear to you His verses that you may be guided" (3: 103) Discuss with the Cubs that all resources available to us are potentially at our service including rope and knots and it's up to us to use it for our benefit and the benefit of others "The best of people are those that bring most benefit to the rest of mankind" (Sahih al-Bukhari)

(Hadith: Bukhari) "There is none amongst the Muslims, who plants a tree or sows seeds, and then a bird, or a person or an animals eats from it, but is regarded as a charitable gift for him"(Hadith: Bukhari)

Cubs can learn about the layout and significance of key locations, such as the Kaaba, Mina, and Arafat, and translate that information into a braille map, promoting accessibility for individuals with visual impairments Activity 2: Inclusive Hajj Storytime Read and discuss stories or biographies of individuals with disabilities who have participated in Hajj Cubs can learn about their experiences, challenges, and contributions to the Hajj community, and discuss ways to promote inclusivity and support for individuals with disabilities during Hajj Activity 3: Disability Awareness Video Produce a video that explores disability awareness and inclusion in Hajj pilgrimage sites. Cubs can research, script, record, and edit the video compiling their learnings from the above activities Raise awareness, promote understanding, and advocate for inclusivity in Hajj through digital storytelling and dialogue
